You can use the **Themes** supplied with PicturesToExe 10, but you can also create your own and you can export and import **Themes** too.



Themes could be a series of presentation effects that are similar in nature, but not all identical. Alternatively, they could be a set of completely different presentation styles, maybe a mixture of your own particular favourites.

Mavic Drone – Photoshop – Raw – Panorama Stitch - Video
